
In Memoriam

SgtMaj. Jorge Sosa (Ret.)

Sergeant Major Jorge F. Sosa, age 68, of Ellijay, Georgia, passed away on Thursday, November 28th, 2024 at his residence.

He was born on August 13th, 1956 in Bogota, Colombia to the late Jorge Enrique Sosa Salazar and the late Consuelo Mutis Gaitan. In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his stepdaughter, Ashley Merriott.

Sergeant Major Sosa was a leader to many, a father to his family, and a loving husband. He served with honor and distinction for 28 and a half years, retiring in June 2006. Throughout his remarkable military career, he dedicated several years to Force Reconnaissance, Infantry, and Security Forces, embodying the highest standards of service and commitment. He deeply loved his wife, Susie, friends, and his Marines, leaving behind a legacy of leadership, devotion, and unwavering dedication to those he served and loved.

Arsanblas of C Company during a night time HALO (high altitude, low opening) parachute insert during a MEU (Marine Expeditionary Unit) exercise in eastern North Carolina. He and his wife, Gracen, had been married just a month when tragedy struck. However, out of this loss sprang new life, a lovely little girl named Margot, born in November. Thanks to your generosity, the Association was able to financially assist Gracen during her time of need.

Remember the Fallen: Beirut 41st Anniversary



2d Reconnaissance Battalion held a special ceremony at sunrise on 23 October to honor the seventeen fallen members of the Battalion on the 41st Anniversary of their sacrifice in the Beirut bombing. As each name was called by the battalion chaplain, sixteen Reconnaissance Marines and one Navy Corpsman stepped forward holding one of the seventeen Paddles bearing the names of each of the fallen. The ceremony concluded with a rifle salute, Taps, and a speech from the Battalion Commander.

The attack: At 0622 on October 23, 1983, a suicide bomber from the terrorist group Hezbollah drove a truck loaded with over 2,000 pounds of explosives through the front gate of the Beirut International Airport and into a building which housed hundreds of Marines. The explosion collapsed the four-story building, killing 241 U.S. servicemembers serving in Lebanon on a dangerous peacekeeping mission. 2d Recon's Charlie Co., 3rd Platoon, lost sixteen Recon Marines and their U.S. Navy Corpsman in this terrible attack.

Editor's note: Three of the survivors, Burnie Matthews (secretary), Pablo Arroyo (chaplain), and Phil Amrhein are active members of the Association.

Book Review: Job/Security

The authors describe *Job/Security* as a "composite portrait of the expanding American security industry." This book interviews persons with a wide range of perspectives, featuring men and women of Homeland Security, Border Patrol, the Secret Service, and emergency management, among others.



One of our own, Pablo Arroyo, is prominently featured, along with his lovely wife, Stacey. He describes his rough childhood in Puerto Rico and then in the Bronx with his single mother and three siblings, having been abandoned by their father and the struggles just to survive—at one time living on a park bench in the fall and winter.

Pablo was grievously wounded during the Beirut bombing, described earlier in this edition. Along with Burnie Matthews, Phil Amrhein, and three others, he was evacuated to a U.S Army hospital in Germany. After several months is Germany, he was transferred back to Camp Lejeune and the Naval Hospital there. Enduring weeks of rehabilitation and physical therapy, he was offered a medical discharge. Pablo told them "I came here to fight, not to take a medical discharge and do nothing."

He went on to a stellar career, serving 20 years with the Connecticut State Police as a diver, bomb detection expert, and as head of the bomb squad. After retiring, he was recruited by the Department of Homeland Security, where he continued to serve. He is currently the Chief Operating Officer for a security firm.

He and Stacey are very active in the Association. Pablo serves as our chaplain. He and Stacey actively compete in Brazilian jiu-jitsu. She is a two-time champion and he is a world champion.

Patrick recently returned from a deployment with the 24th MEU. He will reach the four-year mark in January, and is scheduled to be promoted to sergeant on 1 February.

All joking aside, it was great to see this fine young man. We are very proud of him and of Dave and Jeanette for raising such a high achiever.
